The college library building is centrally located in the first floor of B.Ed. building. Library has a huge collection of 13792 books. It has an assortment of Dictionaries, Encyclopedias, Biographies Autobiographies, M.Ed. Dissertations, Research documents. College subscribes to 4 International Journals, two Newspapers. It has 20 Bound Journals. Reference books are arranged in a separate almirah in the back room, of the library. It is the centre of all learning. The cognitive Hub provides latest information in teacher education, to students and teachers. It is the reference centre to develop latest developments in Philosophy, Psychology, Sociology, ICT and methods of Teaching Sciences, and social sciences. It is a power house giving Insights on inclusive education, Needs of Special Students, and Early child hood education Library is the reference and learning Hub of cognition, central to all academic and research work. College library provides information services to support the teaching and learning process, research and outreach activities of the institute by creating state-of-the art facilities and offering innovative services. Students are central and the heart of Teaching Learning process.

The College library is automated with KOHA software. All the collection is available in the library database and access is available through OPAC to all the users.

The college library subscribes to the UGC's INFLIBNET and NLIST e-Resources so that remote access is possible. Students and staff have access to a varied collection of books and journals of different publications online. The information and link needed to access the library resources is provided to the students and staff. Students are oriented on how to use the library resources remotely during the library orientation programme.
